## Overview

**Ampacity:** These cables must be laid in a single layer with specified spacing (often one cable diameter apart) to avoid the high concentration of heat and magnetic interference that bundling would cause. This restriction often limits the tray capacity severely. Cable tray is the preferred wiring method for industrial facilities, data centers, and large commercial buildings where routing dozens or hundreds of cables through individual conduits would be impractical and expensive.
